Scholarship Winners

The monies given for these scholarships have been invested with Charles Schwab through Wealth Management. Any donor who sets up a scholarship for us to administer has signed a letter of agreement with us, so we know how to invest and how to use the money.

In the 2022-23 school year we awarded a \$3000 grant to Sources of Strength, a peer counseling program for the prevention of suicide and enhanced student to student support. A second grant for \$4000 went to the High School for a logo mural just completed in the main foyer by the Art teachers, and we contributed \$1000 grant to the 8th grade class for their trip to DC.

The Scholarship and Grants Committee will be reviewing the grant proposal application process to simplify it to see if we can attract more teachers to apply.

A surprise source of donation came from families who designated the HAA as a memorial donation for their loved ones when they passed on. The Lemcke and Simmonds families graciously made these donations possible.

Allen Taylor and Norm Kennard are working on drawing up paperwork so that we can accept bequests as well.


As we come to our first anniversary as an incorporated organization, we are working to fulfill our mission of connecting alumni, educators and community through our events, newspaper articles and great support from the school.
